Issue Details

Location of Issue:	Landford Footpath 4
Community Area:	Southern Wiltshire
Parish or Town Council:	Landford
Nature of Issue:	<p>The stile on the boundary between St Andrew's Church car park and the adjoining field on path 4 which runs between Stock Lane and the steps leading to the A36, is failing and is requiring much attention. The Footpath Group have received acceptance of the proposal to replace the stile with a kissing gate from the landowners on either side of the boundary (Landford Parochial Church Council and Mr C Gradidge). The gate is intended as a permanent memorial to Mr MJ Avery who founded the Footpath Group in 1976 and a plaque will be installed at the new gate, although the cost of the plaque is not included in this application .</p>
How long has it been an issue?	Around 12 months.
What would you like done to resolve this issue?	<p>It is proposed to replace the stile with a kissing gate which will be installed and maintained by the Landford Area Footpath Volunteer Group, with help from the County Rights of Way Officer. The gate will be made of metal and sourced from WC stocks as opposed to directly from the manufacturer. eg. https://centrewire.com/products/woodstock-medium-mobility. The cost of a full kissing gate with metal hoops is c.£400. The Landford Parish Community Partnership have offered to provide a grant of £100 to support this application.</p>

As team Leader for the Landford Community Speed Watch Team I have substantial data from CSW and Speed Indicator submissions to Wiltshire Police. As a parishioner I also have photographic and video evidence at this junction. I am therefore formally requesting Landford Parish Council address this drainage issue with respect to run-off water down Lyndhurst Road, Pound Hill and Glebe Lane with Wiltshire Council. A LONG TERM SOLUTION is needed. From information supplied from WC the junction is a 29.0m above sea level and is the lowest point in the village.	
How long has it been an issue?	12 years
What would you like done to resolve this issue? (Max 600 characters)	
There is a recurring drainage issue on Glebe Lane, Landford. Many attempts to resolve the issue have not resulted in a successful outcome. Throughout the year constant pools of rain water inevitably cause road surface damage, verges become eroded and tree roots are exposed. Over the last ten years Wiltshire Council have paid for remediation works. However, it is obvious the root cause has not been addressed. My major concern is the large pool of standing water on the intersection of Lyndhurst Road/Pound Hill/Glebe Lane. The run-off is creating a potential ROAD SAFETY ISSUES... ..
